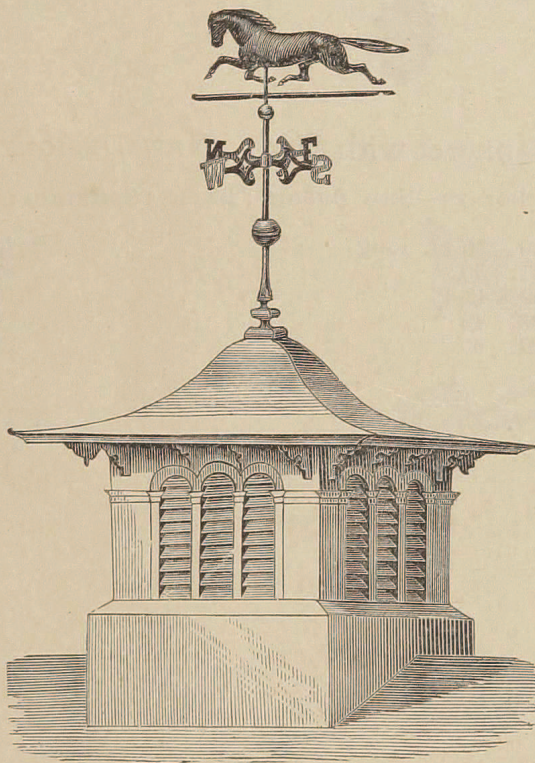

Our VANES and BALLS are made entirely of COPPER, and Gilded with twenty-three carat Gold Leaf, and will not corrode or discolor, but remain bright and clean for many years.



The price of each VANE includes Wrought Iron Spire With Steel Spindle; Cardinal Points, Gilt Letters, and Two Copper Balls.



DIRECTIONS FOR PUTTING UP VANES.

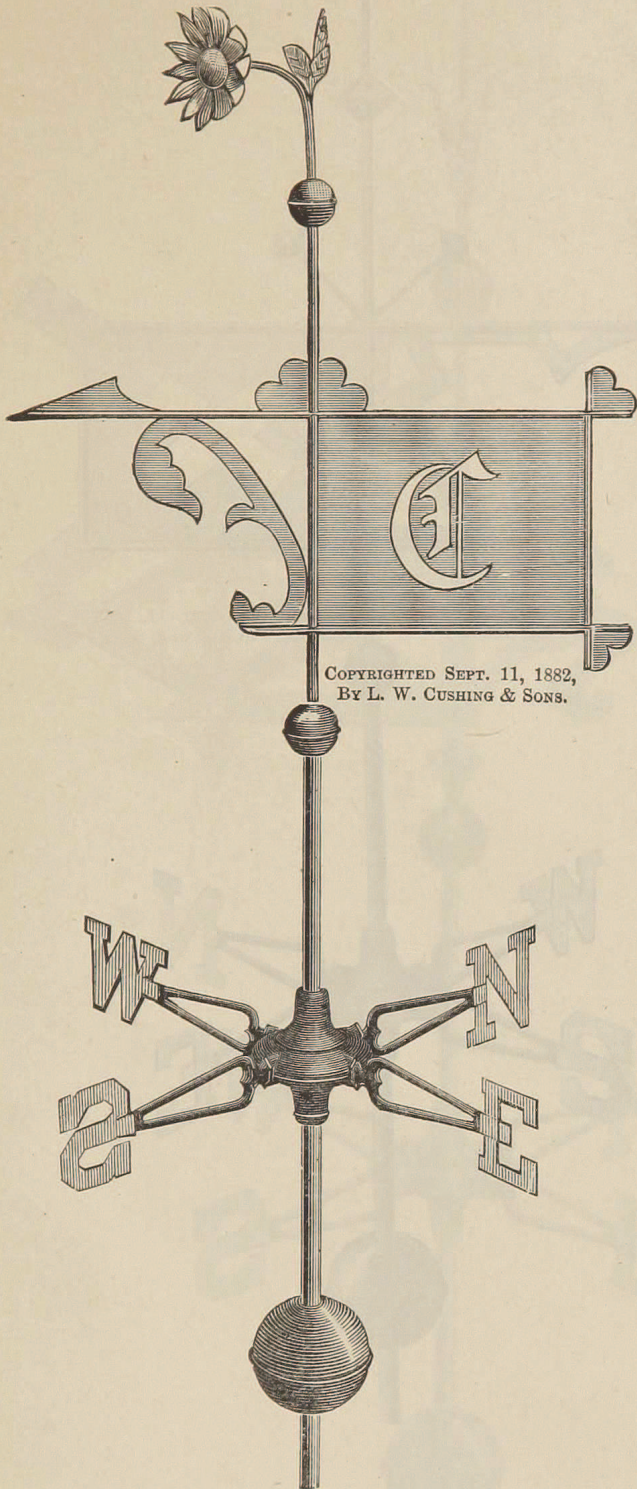
If the Cupola is finished with a wooden post or finial, there should be an iron ring fitted on to the upper end to prevent spiltting.

Bore a hole ten inches deep, $\frac{1}{4}$ or $\frac{1}{2}$ of an inch larger than the spire, then bore two inches deeper the same size of the spire,

For large Vanes, bore this hole sixteen inches deep, $\frac{1}{2}$ or $\frac{3}{4}$ inch larger than the Spire, then bore two inches deeper the same size of the Spire.

Set in the spire, and drive in long tapering wooden wedges covered with white lead or plastic cement, plumbing the spire as you drive the wedges. Put on the large Ball, letting it rest on the top of the finial, then put on the letters, setting the letter N to the North by compass, or the North Star, put on the small Ball, and then the Vane,

NOTE. Do not handle the Gilded parts without using cotton or soft tissue paper in the hand.



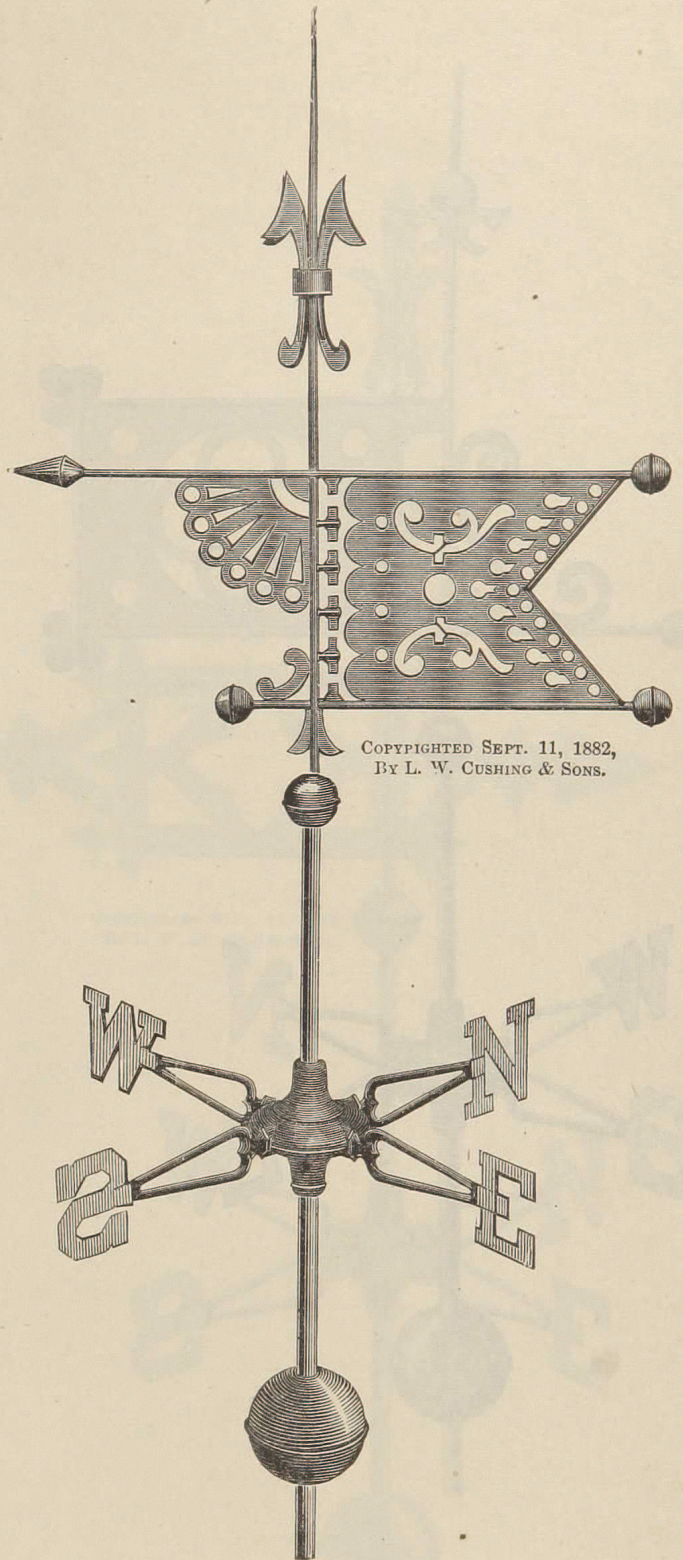

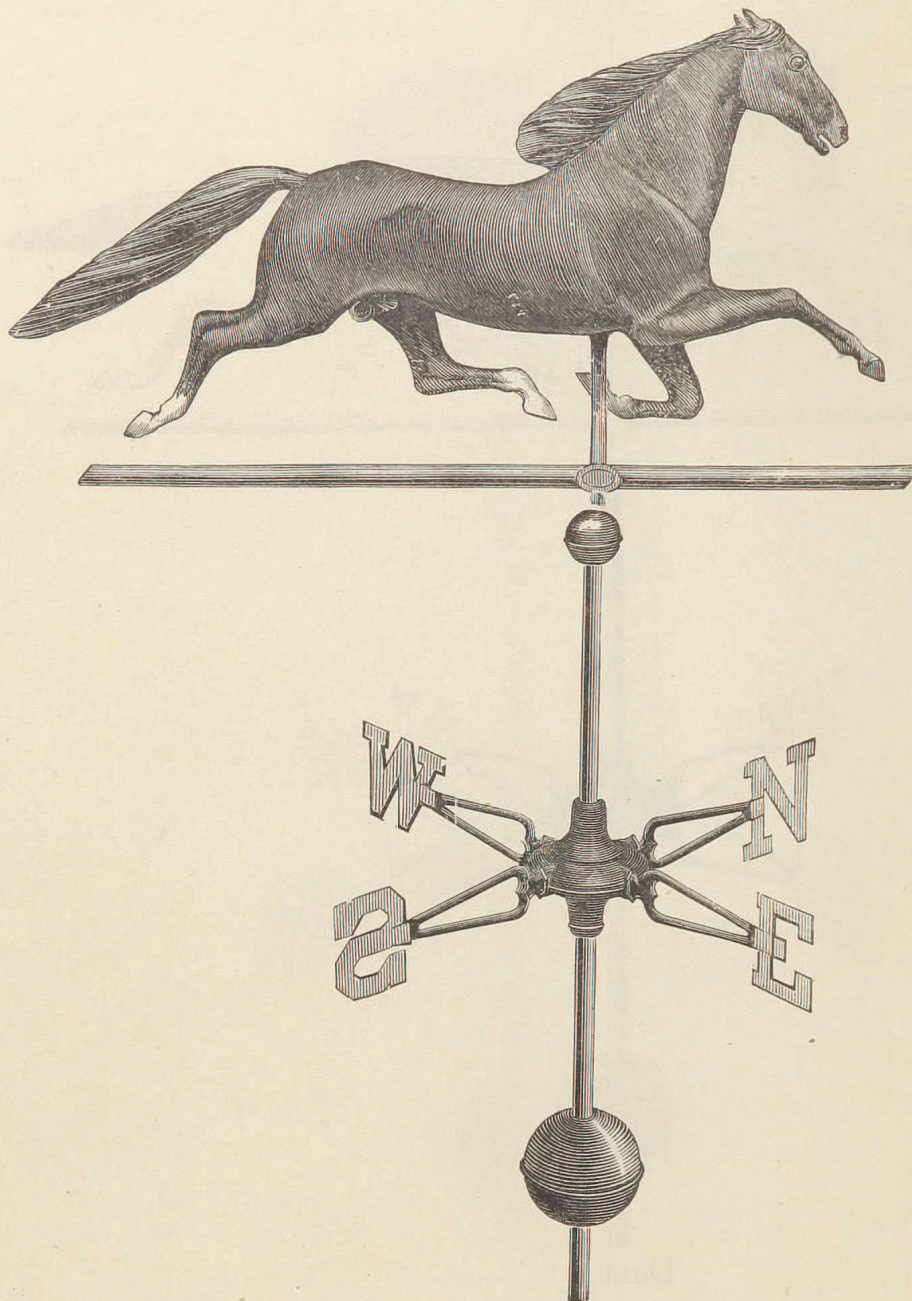

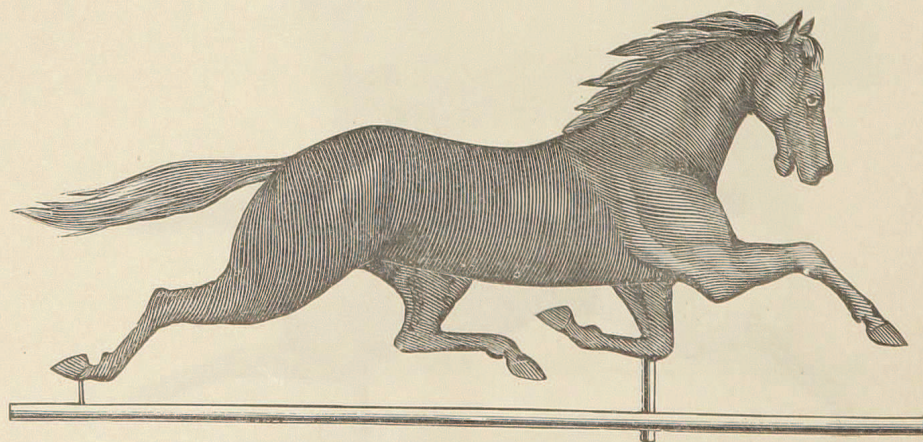
