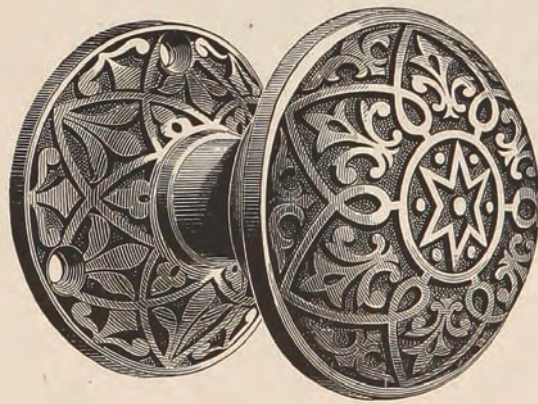
Real Bronze Door Knob No. 390. With Elongated Rose. Real Bronze Escutcheon No. 546.

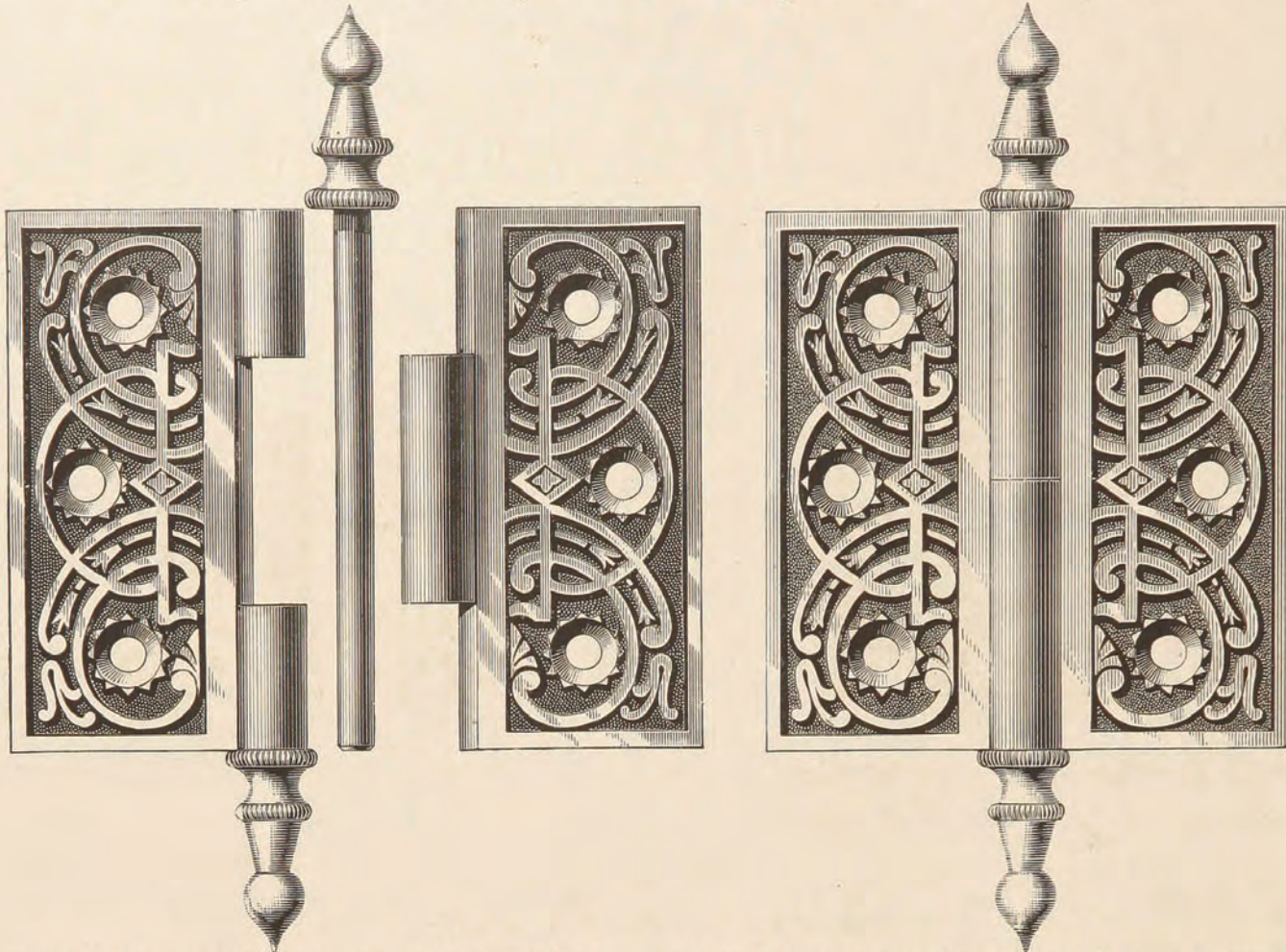
