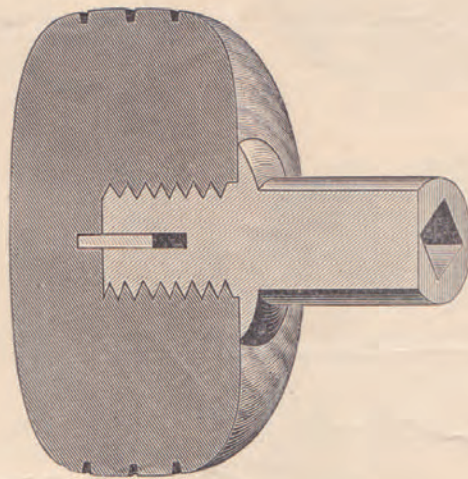




# WOOD DOOR KNOBS.

---

THESE goods have been in the market ten years, and the great success they have met with has induced others to imitate them, but their superiority in finish and durability makes them easily the first of their class. They are carefully made of selected, thoroughly-dried material, beautifully and durably finished, and the trimmings are of solid cast bronze. Experience and improvements in manufacturing have enabled us to reduce their cost, so that now these goods may be used in place of porcelain and other inferior goods, their beautiful finish, their attractive appearance, and their pleasant feeling to the hand, making them the most desirable Knobs ever offered at their price.



This cut shows our patented method of fastening the shank to the head of the knob; the small metal key in the centre is forced into the wood through the aperture of the shank, after the shank has been screwed into its place, rendering it impossible to come loose. Every knob is warranted not to come loose or give out in any way.

WOOD.—They are made regularly in Oak, Apple, Cherry and Mahogany, and to order in Antique Oak, Red Oak, Walnut, Birch, Maple, Yellow Pine and Whitewood without extra charge; and in Sycamore, Cypress, Hazel, Birds-Eye Maple, Rosewood and Ebony at a slight additional charge.

TRIMMINGS.—Regularly of bronze, but are made to order in brass and oxidized brass or bronze and silver or nickel-plated.

SPECIAL NOTICE.—To prevent, as far as possible, the substitution of inferior goods where these Door Knobs are specified, the name BARDSLEY is now stamped upon the shank of every Knob, so that, by a slight inspection, Architects and others can readily ascertain whether they are getting the genuine goods or not.
