On Wednesday, July 23, an ad hoc caravan of cars departed for Gonzales and Suzanne Kittel's <u>Discovery Architectural Antiques</u>, with a

stop at the Cardwell County Courthouse in Lockhart, Texas. Thursday was more organized, with a bus and guide, and visits to The French Legation, built in 1840, and Laguna Gloria, built in 1916. The Legation represented the first government to recognize Texas as a sovereign country and the Laguna Gloria is an exquisite park and building, owned by the Austin Museum of Arts of Fine Art. We also visited the Greek Revival style Neil-Corchran, built in 1855 by the same builder as the Texas Governor's Mansion.

After our frenetic (as usual) day of buying, selling, trading and socializing on Friday, Saturday's Auction followed. The enthusiastic Auctioneer was Nick Doto, who managed to squeeze maximum dollars out of the audience. Paul Woodfin ran the computer. And by the way, sales of the remaining collec-

Pressed Wood and the 1876 Centennial Exhibition

In TDC 172 we reported that Donald G. Tritt had published a exhaustive article in the February, 2012 issue of <u>The Numismatist</u> entitled "An Introduction to Die-Pressed Wood Exonumia", coinlike stuff other than legal tender, such as medals commemorating important events, persons, or decorative pieces. It also includes pressed wooded doorknobs. In the most-recent issue of <u>The Numismatist</u> (July 2014) he has written "Die-Pressed Wooden Medals & Plaques of The 1876 Centennial Exposition". Both articles contain much detail about the Philadelphia Ornamental Wood Company (founded in 1874) and the Ornamental Wood Manufacturing Company of Bridgeport, Connecticut (founded in 1868). The latter's catalogue of 1870, which shows a number of doorknobs, is available from the ADCA website. When some website glitches are cleaned up, the second article will be available on the American Numismatic Association's website – look in the next TDC.

AN ARCHIVES UPDATE

Rhett Butler is in the process of scanning another 75 catalogues (50 of which he contributed) for the Archives. He has also scanned Maud Eastwood's <u>The Antique Doorknob</u> (1976) and <u>Antique Builders Hardware: Knobs and Accessories</u> (1982), both of which are out of print, as well as Supplement No. 1 to <u>ABH</u>. The Club now offers hard copies of only two books, <u>VDA 2 & 3</u> and Maud's <u>150 Years of Builders' Hardware</u> (1993).
